


MOJAVE RIVER was crossed twice, keeping this desert and mountain enduro from becoming a "dry run" (if you'll excuse the pun!)

# Matchless-mounted Johnny Quick Wins 150 Mile National Championship

In AN ENDURO being prompt is more important than being quick. However if your name is Quick, there's nothing left but to be Prompt! If you've followed us this far you've surmised that somebody named Quick won an enduro. Correct! Johnny Quick is the name and he was officially crowned 1960's National Enduro Champion on May 1st with his victory in the 150 mile National Championship Enduro held near San Bernardino. California

Riding a 500cc Matchless Westerner, the 37-year old Quick finished with a near perfect score of 990—losing only ten points over the desert and mountain course. The veteran sports rider headed 90 finishers (out of 206 starters) in this championship run sponsored by the Jackrabbits MC of Bellflower, Calif.

Just one point away from the winner, finishing 2nd, was Earl Wilson, astride a 500cc Triumph. Taking 3rd overall and heading the 650cc Class was Del Smith on a Triumph. 4th man down on the scoresheet and topping the lightweights was the versatile Bill Messer, riding a 250cc Jawa. Jim Brun-

son, riding a 250cc Greeves brought in the 2nd lightweight, finishing a spot behind Messer.

Winner Quick, when later asked what he thought of the course, replied, "It's the best run I've been on in a long time!" Taking a look at the route map we can see where Johnny formed such an opinion, for there was enough types of terrain to suit the tastes of almost every sports rider

First there was the usual desert sand and sagebrush, a seven mile sandwash, a river crossing, mountainous firetrails to 7000 foot high Big Bear Lake—where some nice muddy trails were encountered — some more firetrails, more desert, more mountains, a downhill stretch of loose rock, across the river again and then a final stretch of desert back to the start/finish area—all packed into 150 miles of "on time" motorcycling!

Of noteworthy interest were the two entries in the "two-up" class. Only finishers here were Triumph Dealer Harry Foster and his wife Jo—proving that two can see the countryside as inexpensively as one!


